

Creative technologies has really helped me over the past six months to expand my creative ideas using things such as Adobe Photoshop and Indesign. I have never really used any of the Adobe applications and am loving the works that have been produced.

Throughout the end of Semester in our First year of the BCE course we have been focusing on our end of semester projects. The project covers all four courses that we are under-taking and link together to form our end product.

Indesign- an Adobe software, has really helped me with this. Another useful software that I am now using and practising almost daily, is Photoshop. Photoshop allows me to alter photos, blend images together, cut out certain objects and add higher resolution. Photoshop can pretty much do anything to your photo.



Before undertaking Creative Technologies I never really understood the importance of high-quality images or photos that I use to out up on to my Wordpress Website.

The importance of high-res photos is massive to your clients and audience of your work. It allows them to understand, zoom in and examine your work more clearly. I never really used anything other than my drawings to show off my work, but I now use graphic design concepts and also am more confident in presenting my works as they are at the highest standard.
